Legislative -

Following is a list of MOAA's top legislative priorities: Note: MOAA's advocacy team remains active on many other issues not listed here; MOAA's priorities will be shaped throughout the year depending on concurrent successes or emerging issues that warrant an all-hands approach.

Compensation and service-earned benefits: ensuring pay raises, housing allowances, and retirement benefits for servicemembers and veterans are competitive and fair.

Military housing: improving the quality and oversight of privatized housing and addressing environmental hazards.

Health care for currently serving and retirees: protecting the value and access of the military health care benefit, including pharmacy copays, coverage gaps, and mental health care.

Health care and benefits for veterans: sustaining the Veterans Health Administration missions and services, reforming the presumptive process for toxic exposures, and achieving concurrent receipt of retirement pay and disability pay.

Service families: protecting family support programs, such as housing, PCS, child care, youth programs, and financial counseling.

Survivors: improving survivors' benefits, such as eliminating the Survivor Benefit Plan-Dependency and Indemnity Compensation offset and expanding concurrent receipt eligibility.

Guard and Reserve: achieving equity of benefits, protections, and administrative support for Guard/Reserve members consistent with their active-duty counterparts.

Last Meeting (6 SEP 2023) -

President, MAJ Raul Gonzalez called the meeting to order at 1146 hours.

Attendance: 27

MAJ Raul Gonzalez gave the invocation followed by The Pledge of Allegiance.

MAJ Gonzalez welcomed our members and guests: MAJ Lorraine Holland USA (Ret) Central Florida Area Vice President, Senator Tom Wright, Chris Morris- Legislative Aide, Carol Tennant-surviving spouse of Dale Tennant and Lyn Candy daughter of Dale Tennant.

Lunch was served: Chicken Pesto, Chocolate Cake for dessert.

MAJ Gonzalez asked Frances Gonzalez and LtCol Twila Davis that the 50/50 drawings be done at this time. Followed by the members' free lunch drawing.

LTC Milt Corley won the free lunch for the 4 OCT 2023 meeting/luncheon.

MAJ Gonzalez asked Ms. Lisa Hightower to place the MOAA Level of Excellence medallion for Communication/Website on the flag streamer.

MAJ Gonzalez introduced State Senator Tom Wright: Senator Wright was initially elected to the Florida Senate in 2018 and successfully reelected in 2022 to represent Senate District 08, which consists of parts of Brevard and Volusia Counties. He currently serves as Chair of the Senate Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Vice Chair of the Senate Committee on Commerce and Tourism, and serves as a member on six other Senate Committees. He is also proud to serve as Chair of the Florida Space Caucus, Chair of the Florida Manufacturing Caucus and a member of the Florida Defense Support Task Force. Some of Senator Wright's main legislative priorities have been supporting military and

veteran families, addressing the needs of law enforcement and other first responders, ensuring Florida stays the Space Capital of the world, and striving to protect Floridians through consumer protection and prescription drug transparency initiatives. Throughout his personal life, Senator Wright has dedicated his time and effort to assist with affordable housing for the homeless, and to eliminate the domestic abuse of women, children and animals. He also owns companies in Minnesota that manufacture and distribute air-supplied respiratory protection equipment. As a state senator, he strives to make a positive difference in our great state of Florida.

Senator Wright highlighted a few Bills of the 2023 Legislative Session:

SB 1236/HB 633 K-12 Education (signed into law 5/17/23) -requires school districts to allow dependent children of military personnel to enroll in special academic programs and schools of their choice, regardless of class size or open enrollment dates, when such students arrive during the school year due to their parent being relocated.

SB 732/HB 845 Collegiate Purple Star Campuses (signed into law 5/26/23) sets guidelines for a Florida Collegiate System institution, state university, or career center to join the Collegiate Purple Star Campuses program. The purpose of the Purple Star School Designation is to recognize schools that support the unique needs of military families, help military connected students navigate critical challenges and provide resources for military-connected students when transitioning to a new school environment.

SB 7048/HB 7041 Space Florida (signed into law 6/5/23 reorganizes and makes changes to Space Florida, in order to ensure the are able to efficiently operate as the aerospace industry adapts and evolves. One change was developing professional criteria for an individual to be considered for Board of Directors position.

Senator Wright highlighted the Florida State Budget:

\$116.5 billion overall state budget Over \$14.3 billion in state reserves \$2.7 billion in tax relief for Floridians Significant investments in affordable housing, hurricane recovery, education, environmental infrastructure, and many other key components of our state's operation.

\$90 million brought back to area for improvements

Senator Wright stated there are 1.5 million Veterans in the state of Florida. In support of the Veterans the state has approved another state nursing home for Veterans and a dental care program for indigent Veterans.

Senator Wright stated the Florida National Guard manpower requirements are based on the 1958 population. The Florida National Guard is short by 10,000 members. Working to correct this shortfall.

MAJ Gonzalez thanked Senator Wright for joining us today.

OLD BUSINESS:

President Raul Gonzalez asked MAJ Lorraine Holland to install the Chapter's Elected Officers that were not at the May Installation: 1st Vice President LTC Laura Wickett and Secretary LtCol Twila Davis, MAJ Holland proceeded to install the new officers.

Photos were taken and MAJ Holland passed the gavel to President Gonzalez.

NEW BUSINESS:

MAJ Gonzalez stated the chapter will participate in the DeLand Veterans Day Parade on 11 November 2023 1000 hours.

More details will be discussed at the October meeting.

MAJ Gonzalez announced there is a new Veterans Service Office in Deltona.

Guest Speaker's Bio -

Brig. Gen. Richard "Rich" L. Coffey, III serves as the Assistant Adjutant General – Air, Florida National Guard and the Commander, Florida Air National Guard. Brig. Gen. Coffey is responsible for mission readiness, operations, and coordination of Florida Air



National Guard (FLANG) units at seven different locations. His scope of work includes \$550 million facilities and equipment, \$750 million in aircraft, \$120 million in operating budgets, and command of 2,000 personnel.

Brig. Gen. Coffey was born at Royal Air Force (RAF) Lakenheath, England. He received his commission at the US Air Force Academy in 1994. He has held numerous Command positions in the 125th Fighter Wing to include the Aircraft Maintenance Squadron Commander, Deputy Maintenance Group Commander, Deputy Mission Support Group Commander, Mission Support Group Commander, Vice Wing Commander and was assigned as the interim Fighter Wing Commander. Brig. Gen. Coffey has been stationed at Eglin Air Force Base (AFB), RAF Lakenheath, Pope AFB and Jacksonville International Airport. Prior to his current position, Brig. Gen. Coffey was the Director of Staff for the Florida Air National Guard.

The Chaplain's Corner -

God designed our planet with a tilt in the axis of about 23 degrees. That is what gives us seasons. As the earth rotates more sunlight occurs in the northern or southern hemisphere depending on the season. In the Northern Hemisphere we experience the longest days in June and July and the least sunlight in the winter months. This subtle but predictable change every year affects plants and animals. It affects us as well.

Many people become more lethargic and withdrawn during the darker days. We are prone to do less exercise and our bodies compensate for the cold by storing more fat. It isn't just due to the holidays that we gain weight. Blame it partly on the tilt of the Earth.

We can decorate our homes with brighter colors and we can make an effort to get outdoors to lift our spirits. Plus, we know that after December 22nd the days start getting longer, and spring is not far away.

Barracks of Hope -

Barracks of Hope provides transitional housing for up to 9 months to male and female veterans who have struggled with homelessness, addiction, and mental health. Single occupancy rooms are provided, along with mental health counseling, case management, and three meals per day. In 2019, Barracks of Hope served 52 veterans and helped move 28 into permanent housing.

2024 FCoC Convention Update -

If all goes according to plan, the FCoC will have the web site for registering for the 2024 Convention up and running by early February. That means that there will only be a short period of time to register and secure your place at the convention. The convention itself will begin on 12 May and conclude on 15 May 2024 as we have previously announced. The hotel remains the Shores Resort & Spa in Daytona Beach – it is actually in Daytona Shores hence the name "Shores". This is about five miles south of where US 92 meets A1A.

The Planning Committee has been at work developing activities for attendees that will hopefully encourage you to put your name down quickly once registration opens. Because the convention will be a Sunday to Wednesday event, everyone should be aware that the usual activities at a normal convention will be on a different day.

For those who want to arrive early, registration and hospitality will open at 4 PM on Sunday. This would be a wonderful time to settle in and take advantage of the hotel's amenities, the Azure Oceanfront restaurant, the Oceanview Lounge, and of course the Tiki Hut barefoot beach bar. It would also be a fine time to explore Daytona Beach and seek out the many fine restaurants on offer.

Monday the 13th will be the official start of the convention with registration and hospitality opening at 9 AM. Interested attendees will have an opportunity for tours of Embry Riddle Aeronautical University on Monday and Wednesday mornings. The first FCoC Board Meeting will be at about 3 PM and attendees are welcome to attend this meeting as observers if not an official board member. The traditional President's Reception will start at 6 PM in the first-floor ballrooms. A cash bar will be available and there will be hors-oeuvres. Following that, we plan to have a MAGIC & COMEDY SHOW that should start about 8 PM.

Tuesday will be the heaviest day for activities. Registration and hospitality will open at 10 AM after the FCoC Business Meeting scheduled for 8 AM. The traditional Memorial Service will be held at 9 AM followed by BRUNCH. I encourage you all to take the opportunity to come to the brunch as we plan to

have two speakers who will provide insights that are not in the usual scope of FCoC or MOAA talks.

The normal FCoC and MOAA presentations will follow brunch. For those who are looking for something different or for spouses who are not particularly interested in FCoC/MOAA presentations there will be the opportunity to go to an Afternoon Tea at a local heritage center. The Planners have also met with the local craft spirit distillers to provide samplings of their products which are rum and vodka. More on these opportunities later.

The big event of Tuesday will be the Military Ball. There will be a pre-dinner reception on the top floor of the hotel with excellent views of the beach, the ocean, and the Halifax River. Attendees will need to make their way down to the main ballrooms for the start of the Ball at about 7 PM.

The actual timing of all the events will need further refinement and there might be some changes to the schedule, but I hope you have some idea of what will be in store for you at this wonderful event. An event that provides you the opportunity to gather with your fellow MOAA members and celebrate another great year.

I'd like to remind you that we have arranged for attendees to extend their stay at the Shores for two extra days at the same price as the convention days. In future Communiques I will provide information about what else there is to do in the Daytona area and I sincerely hope you will take advantage of this special opportunity to stay beyond the convention, relax in the oceanfront splendor of the Shores Resort and Spa, and enjoy the "World Famous" Daytona Beach.
