Legislative -

MOAA on TOP 2023 Lobbyist list for 17th Year The Hill, one of the Nation's top Beltway-focused news outlets, has again placed MOAA on the TOP Lobbyist list for the 17th year in a row. Lt Gen Brian T. Kelly, USAF (Ret), stated "The grassroots support of our councils and chapters has been the backbone of our advocacy mission along with the tens of thousands of MOAA members who bring our agenda items to their lawmakers via our Legislative Action Center."

<u>Several of MOAA's advocacy efforts</u> in <u>2023 included</u>;

Bringing several key Legislative proposals into the final FY 2024 National Defense Authorization Act negotiations, which included:

An increase in the Basic Allowance for Housing and a requirement for a detailed report on beneficiary access to the TRI-CARE pharmacy network.

Defending service-earned burial benefits by supporting H.R.1413, the expanding America's National Cemetery Act.

Leading the ongoing push for passage of the Major Richard Star Act, which now has the support of more than two-thirds of lawmakers.

February is a key time to contact your elected officials, February is when congressional offices are submitting their request for the annual National Defense Authorization Act (NOAA).

Contact your representative and senators and urge them to support the Major Richard Star Act (H.R. 1282/S. 344), which would authorize combatinjured veterans to receive their full DoD retirement pay earned for years of service and their full VA disability compensation for lifelong injury.

MAJ Gonzalez asked Maj Curt Voelbel that the 50/50 drawings be done at this time. Then the members' free lunch drawing.

CW4 Thomas Jackson won the free lunch for the 7 FEB 2024 meeting/luncheon.

MAJ Gonzalez introduced: COL Steve Bond FCoC 1stVP

Steve is a retired Colonel and a 29-year veteran of the United States Army. He is currently the Senior Vice President of the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) Florida Council and a Past President of the MOAA Cape Canaveral Chapter (MOAACC). He was initially commissioned as a Second Lieutenant through the ROTC program. He joined the Army for adventure and to travel around the world--He accomplished that goal!

Over his military career, Steve led and commanded units from the Lieutenant (O-1) level as an Airborne Infantry Platoon Leader with 40 soldiers assigned, to the Colonel (O-6) level leading over 450+ assigned soldiers. He also served in key staff positions in Airborne, Infantry, Military Intelligence, Special Operations, and Joint Commands. Steve is a veteran of combat operations in Panama (1989-90) and

Saudi Arabia/Kuwait (1990-91), as well as humanitarian/peacekeeping operations in St. Croix (1989), and Haiti (1994). He was assigned to posts across the United States, and in Italy, Germany and Japan. He is a Military Jumpmaster-Master Parachutist, and Ranger qualified.

He holds a master's degree in history from the University of Kansas, and a bachelor's degree in history from the University of Utah. His military education includes the Army Command and General Staff College, and the Army War College. His military awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star Medal, among others. For his civilian service in Iraq, he was awarded the Department of the Army Meritorious Civilian Service Medal and the Global War on Terror Civilian Service Medal.

COL Bond explained the mission of the FCoC: Intermediate between the chapters and MOAA, Community Service, Legislative: lead and coordinate state legislative matters.

Florida has approximately 38,000 + MOAA members; only about 4,000 belong to a Florida chapter. The largest FL chapter is Cape Canaveral with 1,091 members; the smallest chapter Bay County has 3 members.

COL Bond stated the annual convention is held to encourage camaraderie. He stated since COVID participation has decreased. He is hoping more members will participate in the MAY 2024 convention. He thanked WVMC for hosting the convention.

COL Bond also stated the FCoC Leadership Conference will be held 25-28 JAN 2024 at the Rosen Centre Hotel in Orlando.

COL Bond stated one of our most important goals is to encourage members to contact their Congressmen on supporting MOAA legislative initiatives'.

MAJ Gonzalez thanked COL Bond for speaking to the WVMC today.

The Chaplain's Corner -

On Feb. 3, 1943 the SS Dorchester was sailing for Europe with 900 American soldiers aboard. The ship was about 100 miles off the coast of Greenland when a German submarine launched a torpedo that hit the center of

were scrambling searching for life jackets. Many were young men who had never ventured very far from the place where they born. Naturally many were panicking.

Dorchester. It immediately began to sink. Men

Aboard that ship were four chaplains. Fr. John Washington, a Catholic priest, Rev. Clark Poling, a minister in the Reformed Church in America, Rabbi Alexander Goode, a Jew, and Rev. George Fox, a Methodist minister. Each of these chaplains did what chaplains do in the face of danger. They were a calming influence helping men find life jackets and getting off the sinking ship. They preached courage and offered words of hope.

When all the life jackets were gone the four chaplains gave away the ones they were wearing so others could live. Of the 900 men aboard that ship 230 were saved. The survivors noted the four chaplains were joined arm and arm praying and singing as the Dorchester sank in the icy cold Atlantic.

What joined them in life was the desire to serve God and take care of people. What united them in death was their sacrifice that went beyond the boundaries of denomination. They were men who trusted that God was with them.

Most of us know something about those four brave chaplains who gave their lives so others might live. But they are a reminder to each of us who have served that we all signed up for the same. Military members always know that it is service before self. But you could say that this goes back even further than when we joined the military.

We know that as human beings and as Americans we stand together, especially in times of tragedy. We hold out a hand to someone without asking them their religion. We give food and blankets to the homeless regardless of why they are in that situation. We take care of the vulnerable. I pray that the example of the four chaplains remind us who we are and what we aspire to be each and every day.
