Legislative -

MOAA Assembles on Capitol Hill

April is always an exciting month for MOAA. Annually dedicated MOAA members and staff canvas the halls of Congress, visiting every member's office to discuss issues of importance to the uniformed services and veteran communities.

MOAA's Advocacy in Action (AiA) event held on April 17th put constituents front and center to represent and advocate on behalf of MOAA's 360,000-members.

The association's AiA topics are carefully selected each year and approved by our board of directors.

This year on April 17th, MOAA and our campaign participants will have discussed three critical issues:

- The Major Richard Star Act (H.R. 1282/S. 344): Supports combat-injured veterans by ending an unjust offset for those who lose a dollar of service -earned retirement pay for every dollar of VA disability compensation.
- The BAH Restoration Act (H.R. 2537/S. 1823): Reverses a DoD policy capping the Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) at 95% of local rental and utilities costs — a policy that's placing a financial burden on military families.
- Protect TRICARE For Life (TFL): This remains a key issue for all MOAA members — those already covered by TFL and Medicare, as well as those who'll use the benefit when they turn 65.

Last Meeting (3 APR 2024) -

President MAJ Raul Gonzalez called the meeting to order at 1145 hours.

Attendance: 24

CH Chris Hoffmann gave the invocation followed by The Pledge of Allegiance.

MAJ Gonzalez welcomed our members and guests: LtCol William Quirk, CAPT Charles McLaughlin and CDR Judith McLaughlin. And the guest speaker David Cooke.

Lunch was served: Oven Roasted Pork with Apple Chutney, Mashed Potatoes, Green Beans with Vanilla Cake with Carmel Sauce.

MAJ Gonzalez asked Mrs. Frances Gonzalez that the 50/50 drawings be done at this time. Then the members' free lunch drawing. Ms. Lisa Hightower won the free lunch for the 1 May 2024 meeting/luncheon.

MAJ Gonzalez introduced the guest speaker: David Cooke currently serves as the FDOT District 5 Rail Administration Manager. He has over 30 years of public and private sector transportation experience. A graduate of the University of Central Florida with a Bachelor's degree in Public Administration. He is a native Floridian and lifelong resident of Volusia County.

Mr. Cooke gave an overview of SunRail and an update on current expansion projects. The original intent for SunRail was to provide a means of transportation for commuters connecting the City of Orlando, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, and Volusia counties. The trains currently run Monday through Friday, no weekend service. The current system spans 49 miles and services 16 stations. There are 40 SunRail trains in operation per day. The trains are ADA accessible with restrooms. Many train riders bring their bicycles on the train.... over 200 per day. The trains are available for sponsors to provide transportation to specific events.

The construction of the Phase 2 North expansion includes the addition of a new SunRail station adjacent to the current DeLand Amtrak Station situated on the existing Central Florida Rail Corridor. The project will add 12.2 miles to the SunRail corridor expanding service from the DeBary SunRail Station to the new DeLand Station with the projected opening the end of May 2024. CSX, Amtrak, and FCEN (Florida Central) operate daily as tenant railroads on Central Florida Rail Corridor (CFRC). FDOT owns the tracks.

MAJ Gonzalez thanked David Cooke for speaking to the WVMC today and presented him with a Certificate of Appreciation.

MAJ Gonzalez asked if there were any corrections to the 6 March 2024 Luncheon Meeting Minutes as posted in the VOC. Motion to approve the minutes as posted in the VOC was made by LTC Laura Wickett and seconded by COL Jack Burtnett. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

MAJ Gonzalez asked LtCol Twila Davis to read the Slate of Officers to be elected. He then asked if there were any nominations from the floor. There being none, MAJ Gonzalez asked for a motion to elect the officers as listed in the slate. Motion to elect the WVMC Officers for 2024-2025 as read from the Slate of Officers was made by LtCol William Quirk and seconded by LTC Ernie Tauber. Motion carried. MAJ Gonzalez congratulated the newly elected officers and thanked them for stepping up. Installation of officers will be held at the 1 May 2024 luncheon meeting.

MAJ Gonzalez stated our Chapter is hosting the FCoC Conference 12-15 May 2024 at the Shores Resort and Spa 2637 S. Atlantic Ave, Daytona Beach, FL. And asked Maj Pete Durnell for an update. Maj Durnell stated that everything is set to go. The committee is in the process of collecting silent auction items. We need volunteers to help

Obituary for Mick Cotton—

Maj Marion "Mick" Cotten, USMC (Ret), age 89, passed away on April 14, 2023, surrounded by family. Mick was born on June 5, 1934, to Andrew B. Cotten and Inez Cotten (Starkey). He grew up in Scottsboro, Mobile, Chickasaw and Fairhope, AL, along with a sister and four brothers. Mick married Pauline Marie Foisy on June 16, 1956. Together they raised four children and volunteered with numerous organizations during his 26-year Marine Corps career. After retiring in Deltona, FL, he was very active in the community and church. He held numerous leadership positions and was an active member of the Knights of Columbus, Military Officers Association of America (MOAA), the American Legion, the Marine Corps League, and the Veterans Community Education Partnership for West Volusia, Inc. where he was the founding chairman. Mick was also a Lector and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion at Our Lady of The Lakes Catholic Church in Deltona, FL. He was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather. Mick was predeceased by his beloved wife Pauline. Services were held on April 24 in Bluffton, SC.

The Chaplain's Corner -

.Memorial Day for many may be a holiday to spend with family. It might mean time off from work or school. While it is all of those things to so many. It is, however, a time to pause and be grateful for those who have served in our armed forces and paid the ultimate sacrifice.

You and I know that we came home when our time in service was complete. Others did not return to a joyous homecoming. Their sacrifice is marked with a gravestone and flowers. They are in our thoughts and memories and we long to be joined with them when God calls us home.

The reason for this day goes back to the Civil War. About 600,000 people died in that conflict. Military cemeteries had been established in many cities throughout the country. Some records indicate that former enslaved people from Charleston, SC were the first to hold commemorations within months of the end of the Civil War. Yet, the federal government in 1966 chose Waterloo, NY as the birthplace of this holiday. There residents gathered annually to remember the fallen and decorate their graves with flowers and flags beginning as early as 1866.

Originally this holiday was called Decoration Day for that reason. It was celebrated each year on May 30th. In 1971 the government declared that Memorial Day would be a national holiday to be celebrated the last Monday of May.

It seems to me that we ought to solemnly celebrate Memorial Day with tributes to our fallen comrades and then celebrate that we are free. However you celebrate Memorial Day be thankful that when our nation called, those before us responded with all they had. We were fortunate to have served and came home to honor their memory. Now it is our job to teach those who come after us to be thankful and generous in serving if the need arises.
