As the legislative slate resets for the 119th Congress, MOAA member engagement will become even more vital to achieving our advocacy objectives. MOAA needs your help to build support for new objectives and emerging issues.

Following are Key MOAA priorities for 2025:

Currently Serving (Unaccompanied housing): Recent reporting from the Government Accountability Office (GAO) revealed the challenges facing service members in unaccompanied housing. MOAA seeks to improve funding and transparency.

Retirees/Veterans (Toxic exposure): MOAA supports and will advocate for veterans exposed to toxic materials.

Family/Survivors (Spouse employment): Passing the Military Spouse Hiring Act will provide another important lever needed to address the critical issue of spouse unemployment.

DoD Health Care (Access to care): MOAA seeks a digital MHS assistance platform allowing beneficiaries to report access-to-care challenges

LTC Wickett asked Maj Curt Voelbel that the 50/50 drawings be done at this time. Then the members' free lunch drawing.

LtCol Twila Davis won the free lunch for the 5 FEB 2025 meeting/luncheon.

LTC Michael Magee introduced our guest speaker: Zach Zacharias is a Native Floridian born and raised in Miami, Florida. He holds degrees from Florida State University with a degree in communications, University of Central Florida with a degree in American history, and Nova Southeastern University with a master's in education.

Zach has worked for 30 years at the Museum of Arts and Sciences in Daytona Beach and until recently oversaw the educational programming at the museum and has worked with exhibits such as Picasso, Salvadori Dali, Dale Chihuly, Glories of Ancient Egypt, Great Asian Dinosaurs World War II, and many more! Zach is a current member on the Volusia County Historic Preservation Board and is the current chair. Zacharias has created programs at the museum such as, Florida History Con, Natural History Festival, Afternoon with Florida History, Volusia Collects, September with the Smithsonian, and many other programs. Zach has given lectures and presentations all over Central and North Florida on various Florida history topics.

Zach Specializes in Florida History, Florida natural history and Florida historical landscapes. He has self-published a book on Florida forts titled

"Florida Forts on the Edge of Empire" Zach is a cast member of a local PBS Show with 21 episodes called the Fossil Hunters about fossiling in Florida. Zach is a member of Deland Lunch Rotary and is a Paul Harris Fellow and Rotarian of the Year for 2019 and 2022.

Zach explained details of 7 of the estimated 400 Forts located in Florida. Information included the type of construction of the forts, the battles that took place there and the current status of these forts. Many are now state parks and can be visited.

LTC Wickett presented Zack Zacharias with a certificate of appreciation and thanked him for speaking to us today.

LTC Wickett asked if there were any corrections to the 6 NOV 2024 Luncheon Meeting Minutes as posted in the VOC. Motion to approve the minutes as posted in the VOC was made by CW04 Ted Seaman and seconded by COL Jack Burtnett. Motion carried.

Life is Unfair

Into every life there are wonderful and exciting things that happen. But equally true into most people's lives there are things that happen that are often unfair, occasionally cruel, and always demanding. Some of them we try to escape from. Other things like injustice we should change if we can. But often our problems will not yield to either of these solutions. The only healthy way then forward is to accept life as it really is and deal with it that way.

When a person is facing illness, dementia, or the effects of aging it can be frustrating and lonely. Letting go of things that we took for granted, like driving a car, cooking a meal, or taking a walk become difficult or impossible.

Family and care givers often wonder what they should say to the person facing these things. Sometimes the best thing is to simply listen. Real listening happens all too rarely. Often we are distracted by our own concerns, things on television, difficulties with a family member or co-worker or other things. when someone really listens to you, you realize what a special gift they are giving you. Often because those closest to us are busy people will seek the advice of clergy or a therapist. That is not a bad thing, but wouldn't it be better if you and I could be that person who really listens when someone needs that?

Is someone in your life hurting, grieving, angry, or lonely? Do not be anxious around them because you do not know what to say. Seldom is it important for you to say anything, nor could "the right words" fix their pain. No, most of the time all a hurting person wants is for someone to take the time to hear them, be with them, in silence or in conversation. Just listen.

There is no greater gift you can give in the face of suffering. Listening is better than flowers, better than a casserole, better than good advice. It is the gift every one of us could give, if we would only tone down the other distractions filling our own heads. Let's make it our aim this year to give enough silence and peace to those in need and really listen to the words of another human heart.
