President's Perspective—



During the February Meeting I asked you to think about items that may be donated to be included in a "Summer Fun" raffle basket. Our Spring Picnic will be April 25th at American Legion Post 6, 11am -2pm. There will be more information forthcoming.

I want to thank all of you who support the MOAA Advocacy efforts. The key goals for the 119th Congress are:

1. Shutdown Fairness Act (S.3168) which protects service members' pay during any future shutdowns. The bill would ensure members of the armed services to include the reserve component, receive their pay during any future lapse in appropriations.
2. Improve and Enhance the Work Opportunity Tax Credit Act (H.R. 6231 and S.3265) these modernizes the Work Opportunity Tax Credit; it is a nonrefundable tax credit employers can take for hiring target group members during the employees first year on the job, i.e. unemployed veterans and military spouses.
3. The Military Care Act (H.R. 6796) which requires the Pentagon to establish a digital system designed to improve access to care at military treatment facilities (MTF) by providing a standardized platform to report barriers to MTF care. It will support all TRICARE beneficiaries but especially military families.

I ask all of us to continue the work of addressing the needs of our military families, veterans, and retirees to both our state and national legislators.

• Deliver in spreadsheet and PowerPoint format

DEBRIEF
REVIEW AND MAKE CORRECTIONS to gaps, targets and outreach strategy.
Refine until the plan is clear and actionable.

Last Meeting (4 FEB 2026) -

President LTC Laura Wickett called the meeting to order at 1143 hours.

Attendance: 26

CH LtCol Chris Hoffmann gave the invocation followed by The Pledge of Allegiance.

LTC Wickett welcomed our members and guests: Dr. Sean Ricks and Elizabeth Lee-Guest of LTC Ernie Tauber

Lunch was served: Chicken Marsala with Wild Mushroom Sauce, Mashed Potatoes, Green Beans and Chocolate Cake for dessert

LTC Wickett asked LtCol Twila Davis that the 50/50 drawings be done at this time. Then the members' free lunch drawing.

LTC Laura Wickett won the free lunch for the 4 MAR 2026 meeting/luncheon.

LTC Wickett asked LTC Michael Magee to introduce our guest speakers: Dr. Sean Ricks PhD., Pastor & Hospice Chaplain for Brevard County. Dr. Ricks attended the United States Merchant Marine Academy and graduated in 1991 with a Bachelor of Science in Marine Engineering and a Reserve commission in the Navy as an Ensign. In 2005, he went on Active Duty and remained there until he medically retired in 2018. He deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan and was forward-deployed to Yokosuka, Japan, aboard the USS George Washington. Last assignment AFPAK Hands Intel Officer Kabul Security Forces and GIRoA (AFG). Following his retirement, he and his wife, Keely, moved to Florida. In 2019, he felt called to seminary and entered Regent University, where he achieved a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry, both in Chaplain Ministries. He's worked as a hospice chaplain and now works as a hospital chaplain. He and Keely lead an outpost of the Church of 1122 in Melbourne, Florida, out of Jacksonville, Florida. They have five adult children, six perfect grandchildren, and a beautiful bloodhound.

CH LtCol Chris Hoffmann our Chapter's Chaplain and pastor at Our Lady of the Lakes in Deltona, Fr Chris was ordained for the Diocese of Orlando in 1987. Over the course of the last 34 years, he has had 10 assignments. Besides being a pastor,

Father Chris has been assigned to two of our Diocese's Catholic high schools as chaplain. He has also done campus ministry at Stetson University for seven years. While in seminary, he had a good friend who had been in ROTC at Marquette University, where he attended. He told him how important "his chaplain" had been in getting him and his family settled in their first assignment. Father Chris thought to himself: "I could do that." One thing led to another—and while his Bishop, Bishop Grady, was not excited about losing one of his young pastors to active duty—when he offered the option of Reservist--permission was granted. Father Chris was accepted into the Air Force Chaplaincy program as a Chaplain Candidate and was commissioned in 1985. For most of his career Father Chris was assigned to Patrick AFB where he performed his ministry responsibilities. Activated in 1991 for two months during Desert Storm he was assigned to Hurlburt Field, the Air Force's Special Operations Command. In 2008 he volunteered for a 4-month deployment at Al Udeid AB in Qatar. That experience included celebrating Mass for personnel in Saudi Arabia several times that summer. He served in the USAF Reserve and retired in 2009.

The round table discussion included the following topics:
How do the major and divergent faiths work in the military--Chaplain Corps and the Mental Health Professionals—work to keep the US Military the Most Lethal Fighting Force on the Planet?
Does One's Faith Prepare our military—from E-1 to O-10--for Battle (Missions)? How?
Experiences—as a Catholic father—with providing spiritual guidance especially in light of all the multi-denominational and intersectionality inputs.

Dr. Ricks and CH Fr Hoffmann shared their personal experiences and gave very informative comments to the topics.

LTC Wickett thanked Dr. Sean Ricks and Fr. Chris Hoffman for a very informative presentation about Holy Month and religion in the military.

LTC Wickett asked if there were any corrections to the 7 JAN 2026 Luncheon Meeting Minutes as posted in the VOC. Motion to approve the minutes

Basic and Premium members may receive legitimate renewal or upgrade notices through various channels, but when in doubt, verify directly with MOAA and visit www.MOAA.org/scams for additional fraud-prevention resources. *Stay alert!*

The Chaplain's Corner -*Simplifying Life*

I read an article not long ago that said we spend the first half of our life acquiring things and the second half of life getting rid of things. I don't think it is quite that neat of a division, but it is probably accurate to say that when you are twenty or thirty you imagine you would like a vacation home, an ATV, a boat, or other recreational things. It seems like you would get a lot of use out of these things. As we get older, we realize we don't have the time or desire to use all those items we thought would be such fun. Instead, they become more of a burden to clean, repair and insure. Often enough, that is the time in life that we begin to ask, "Do I really need all these things?" Maybe not.

I have also discovered that the task of cleaning out the garage, selling big-ticket items, or changing behaviors is not easy. The task seems too daunting. One strategy is to start small. Do one thing each day rather than try to clean out the entire garage. In some ways this strategy is the best way to attain holiness too. If you want to get closer to God or make a difference in the world it seems impossible to find the time to do so. So, start with just one thing.

One man learned this process when he gave a year of his life to the Jesuit Volunteers. Having limited funds meant he couldn't afford to have a car, so he took the bus. He learned that this gave him quiet time to pray as he was waiting or while riding the bus. It also meant he had time to share with those clients he was helping with the Volunteers. Too often we believe we don't have enough time or money. Changing one thing can change your life.

I have found that we enjoy having new things. Putting on clothes the first time, smelling the interior of a new car and eating at a new restaurant is invigorating...but only for a short while. What we really want is to

experience happiness. We soon find that those new things no longer do it. One woman started gardening, repairing old items, and shopping at second hand stores. She discovered the same excitement and it cost a lot less!

Think of one way you can simplify your life. You just might find happiness soon follows.

In addition to her work as a Florida Ambassador to the Women in Military Service for America Memorial, Washington, DC., Ms. Broadway volunteers with the Department of Defense Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR) Florida Committee, where she serves as State Committee Chair. She also continues to serve the Army Reserve as the President, Senior Army Reserve Commanders Association (SARCA). Ms. Broadway resides in Astor, Florida with her husband, Garan.

Guest Speaker Bio -

Ms. Broadway was born in Wichita, Kansas and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemical Science from Kansas State University, Manhattan, Kansas. She was the first female cadet to receive an Army ROTC commission from Kansas State University in 1976. Ms. Broadway served over 35 years in the Army and Army Reserve and achieved the rank of Major General before retiring from the Army Reserve in June 2011. She commanded units at the battalion, brigade, and General Officer level. Her final military assignment was the Deputy Commanding General, Army Reserve, US Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC), Ft. Monroe, Virginia.



Ms. Broadway also maintained a successful civilian career while serving in the Army Reserve. She worked at operational and strategic levels of the Army Reserve as a Federal Civil Service employee in training, logistics, personnel, and strategic planning. Before retiring in June 2014, her final civilian position was the Deputy Command Executive Officer and Director, Civilian Personnel Management for the United States Army Reserve Command (USARC), Ft. Bragg, North Carolina. In these roles, she developed policies and collaborated with employers to address the challenges Reserve Component Service Members encounter when balancing a civilian career with the desire to serve their country.

Her civilian awards include the Federal Civil Service Exceptional Civilian Service Award, the Department of the Army Superior Civilian Service Award, ESGR Seven Seals Award and the President's Volunteer Service Award. Her military
